Jim Andrews decided that a mid-life crisis cure was a self-propelled trip from Kittery to Fort Kent. **Over 38 days in summer 2012**, Jim bicycled, rowed, poled, paddled, and hiked nearly 600 miles from the tip of Gerrish Island in Kittery to the "northern door" of Maine at Fort Kent. The journey included plenty of new discoveries about the State of Maine, himself, and the relationship of people to remote places. Jim is an attorney, Registered Maine Guide, writer, husband, dad and sixth-generation Mainer who grew up in the hills of Oxford County and now lives in Farmington.
