

Hiking Baxter State Park End-to-End with Carey & Fran



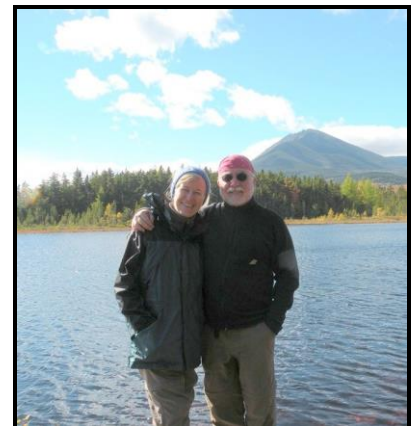

The route covered 85 miles from Togue Pond Gate at the southern end of Baxter State Park to Matagamom Gate in the far northeast corner.
